Boating Safety Course offered by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary

Course Description: This introductory boating class will give you the knowledge needed to obtain a Florida Boating Education ID card (or equivalent boat license or safety certification in many states). Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete About Boating Safely.

Effective January 1, 2010, boat operators who were born on or after January 1, 1988 must have a Florida Boating Safety Education Identification Card in order to operate a motorboat with ten horsepower or more. This course meets the educational requirements to receive the boating safety identification card.
